

Phase 1 of Strive Endorsement

- Fall 2009 Pre-Test Results
 - 1,070 DECAs
 - o157 Infant
 - 0175 Toddler
 - •738 Preschool

Fall 2009 DECA: Percent of Children (n=1070)*	Strength	Typical	Concern
Initiative	16.00%	67.90%	16.20%
Self Control (n=913)* Attachment	17.10% 14.90%	66.70% 70.30%	16.20% 14.90%
Total Protective Factors	15.10%	68.10%	16.70%
Behavior Concerns (n=738)*		78.60%	21.40%

Improvement from T1 to T3 (n=202)	Demonstrated Improvement	Significantly Improved (of those that improved)
Initiative	59.9% (121)	47.11% (57)
Self Control	53.96% (109)	52.29% (57)
Attachment	39.1% (79)	41.77% (33)
Total Protective Factors	54.95% (111)	45.94% (51)
Behavior Concerns	49% (99)	30.3% (30)

- Year-End Results to Date:
 - 850 (79%) of children retained from pre- to post-test
 - 089% of infants and toddlers
 - **o75% of preschoolers**

Teacher Efficacy

- 40 teachers completed from 21 centers
- Surveyed teacher confidence:
 "I can make a difference in the lives of children":
 - Pre assessment 85%
 - Post assessment 100%

Teacher Efficacy

 100% would recommend ECMH Services

 92% said that consultation positively impacted their choice to stay in their current position
